Oregon Project Independence (OPI) provides limited in-home services to people who need a help to continue living independently in their own homes. OPI is a needs-based program and is funded by the state of Oregon.



WHO QUALIFIES?

OPI is available to those who:

- Live in Oregon.
- Are 60 and over.
- Or are under 60 years of age with a diagnosis of Alzheimer's Disease or a related disorder.
- Do not receive Medicaid coverage, Oregon Health Plan or long-term care services
- Need help from another person with Activities of Daily Living, such as walking, dressing, eating, going to the bathroom, and bathing

DID YOU KNOW?

Some of the services and supports available through OPI include:

- Meals on Wheels.
- Housekeeping assistance.
- Personal care assistance.
- Health and medical equipment.
- Caregiver support.

There is a sliding scale fee for this program. The cost is based on monthly household income minus the household's monthly medical costs.
